Dorothy Graeber Lipman, a Memphian for nearly 70 years, passed peacefully on Sunday, April 26 following a long illness.

"Dot" was beloved to her many friends for her warm heart, kindness and thoughtfulness towards others. She was well-known for her social and outgoing nature and loved nothing more than to be in the company of friends and family. Even from her hospital bed while dealing with a prolonged illness, she always had a warm smile and a twinkle in her eyes for any nurse or visitor and was more concerned for their welfare than her own.

Dorothy was born and grew up in Vicksburg, Mississippi and met her husband, Herb, on a blind date during a brief visit to Memphis. The couple were married for 65 years before his death in 2016.

Herb was a graduate of the University of Tennessee and an ardent fan of the Vols.
